CDP WHAT IS NEW

The New program to replace CDP is being developed in partnership with First Nations people and remote communities. It will allow communities to determine local projects and job priorities. Communities may also apply for funding to cover capital and equipment cost for new projects or enterprises that will help generate new jobs.

The Remote Jobs and Economic Development (RJED) Program will help some CDP participants move to having a real job with an employer. CDP will continue to be available to support all participants including those who require additional support to find a job or who are not work ready.

CDP providers have been extended to ensure that the design of New employment service for remote Australia can develop along side broader employment service reforms.

Through the Remote Jobs and Economic Development Program, the Government is substantially increasing its overall investment in remote employment. There will be an increase in the proportion of funding available for Workforce Development initiatives.

NIAA will require the development of Workforce plans; CDP providers will work with communities and employers to develop new work plans that support local workforce development and providers pathways into employment for participants by new jobs created through RJED and other existing and emerging opportunities.

A New remote employment service is being developed in parallel with broader work across Government on Employment White Paper, the inquiry into Workforce Australia Employment Services, reforms to Disability Employment Services.

CDP WHAT IS NEW

Community Projects (Trials) Update

Community Projects Pathway to Real Jobs has come to an end and this has seen about 10 participants move into ongoing employment at the end of the trial. This is great news for all involved in the Trial, To celebrate the hard work of Stage 1 participants they were awarded with a purchase order for the local supermarket or store.

Stage 2 has just kicked off with new participants taking part in all 3 regions. Stage 2 of the trial will also see First Aid Training coming to Tennant Creek and Ali Curung with dates to be confirmed. We have also held White Card training as part of the trial to help support employment opportunities for those wishing to work in the construction industry.

We had Arrernte Boxing engage so far in Elliot for the first week as of the 26th of February and they had an amazing time, and the community was very welcoming and engaged well with the team. We were even super lucky to have young man Chabascoe attend with the Team who is a TO for Elliot.

Adam Drake from Balance Choice is down in Mutitjulu for 3 weeks and kicked off in Community on the 11th of March. The community has been amazing and very engaging with Adam. His first week has seen him engage with the College in Yulara and taking part in the Mutitjulu School Sports Carnival; cooking pancakes and taking part in events to encourage and support the kids to get involved. Adam has also been running morning session in the community, which seen one person on the first day and then 11 people turning up before school and taking part in 40 minute training session. RN Staff have welcomed Adam with open arms and have really enjoyed working with Adam and seeing the amazing work that he does.

CDP Trials Good News Story

Meshach Bonney had previously been under the very first trial rolled out and was place at the Hardware store. Meshach was doing well and enjoying his role and the opportunity to learn many new skills along the journey. At the end of the Trial Meshach was offered ongoing paid employment at the Hardware, however due to financial issues within the business he was made redundant a few week after the offer.

Meshach came to RN Employment for support to gain employment and support as he was feeling a little down and out. Meshach was then offered the chance to be on the new round of the Trials as a Youth Officer with Sports & Rec.

Meshach was happy to have paid employment, however due to the ups and downs of life he went a little off track which affected his attendance in the beginning. With support from both his employer and team at RN Employment, he has now been successful in being offered ongoing employment in his role and has successfully completed the trial placement and proved he is willing and ready to move into fulltime or part time employment

We are hoping to have a nice big pile of wood ready at the site the week before the event.

Docker River School commenced for the start of the new term this week with New School Principal Kyla. Kyla had been teaching here in Docker River for the last six months of 2023 and has now returned to take on the role as Principal, Kyla who is passionate about teaching and a strong advocate for Docker River Primary School to continue running and providing education to the Children of Docker River community. RN will continue to support with school and community events such as Colour Smash and Health Eating picnic day as we did last year.

Ali Curung

Ali Curung and surrounding communities had the opportunity to participate in several training opportunities run in Ali Curung, White card & Drivesafe. The training had wonderful attendance with 16 of our clients from Ali Curung and Tara Communities have successfully gained their white cards. The Drivesafe training too had great attendance with 15 clients obtaining their Learners, and an additional 9 clients obtaining their provisional licenses.

Centrelink have attended the community; with the support of Staff at RN Employment we have been able to work together to assist clients with their claims and/or information needed.

A family fun day was held at the local school at the end of last year in which RN Employment proudly supported , offering Fresh fruit, and giving away plenty of RN merchandise
